5 ESSENTIALS OF STORYTELLING



1. THE INCITING EVENT

The sole purpose of the inciting event is to knock the main character (you) out of their routine or upset the balance of their life in some way.

2. PROGRESSIVE COMPLICATIONS

You experience escalating degrees of conflict. If you do one thing, you'll potentially put yourself in great danger—physical or emotional. If you don't, you may be tormented by regret.



3. THE CRISIS

You absolutely must make a decision. This decision will determine whether you'll get closer to or farther away from your object of desire.

4. THE CLIMAX

You make a decision—where you answer the question raised by the crisis. The decision you make will reveal who you are as a character to the reader.



5. THE RESOLUTION

You make sense out of all that has happened. If the inciting event shows the reader the before, the resolution is where the reader gets to see the after.

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
